

🌳 Tall Oaks' Educational Philosophy

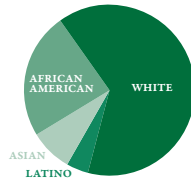
At all its levels, programs and teachings, TOCS seeks to:

Who We Are

Tall Oaks Classical School educates children from kindergarten through 12th grade using classical methods and a Christian worldview. With this in mind, TOCS is developing a Day of Service to engage the students to ask themselves, “What time, talent and treasure has God given me that I can use to bless others?” An interactive curriculum will surround the day, as students learn the concept of using time, talent and treasure, and reflect upon the impact the day made in their lives and the lives of others. Every student in the school (along with their parents) will be challenged to serve in local Christian, civic, and community organizations and ministries.

The Day of Service

We seek to train Christian leaders who will righteously lead as citizens in their communities. With this in mind, TOCS is developing a Day of Service, to be held on April 15, 2011 from 8:30 to 2:30. This teaching opportunity will engage the students to ask themselves, “What has God given me that I can use to bless others?”

A stewardship curriculum will surround the Day of Service to orient students to the concepts of using our God-given time, talent and treasure. Two weeks prior to the day, our director of stewardship will introduce each of the 19 classes to stewardship, and how it relates to their total learning experience. After the event, students will communicate in written or artistic forms, how their service played a role in making God known, how the work changed the students’ perspectives on the needs of others, and possible ways they could continue their work with one of the ministries.

Students, from kindergarten through 12th grade, will be grouped by their skill sets and will serve in ways suited to them. Tall Oaks will communicate with community organizations to determine how their needs can be met by our students. Organizations include A Door of Hope, Sunday Breakfast Mission, New Castle Senior Center, Shoes-2-Share and Elkton Community Kitchen. Young children will be creating crafts with senior citizens. Students in middle-school will pick up yard waste accumulated over the winter and teens in high school will paint walls and doorways. There will be many opportunities to visit or sing to people suffering from Alzheimer’s or long-term illnesses. Along with our staff, we encourage parents to join us for the day as drivers and chaperones. From the kindergarten to the graduating senior, all can glorify God through the careful use of the time, talent and treasure that He has bestowed no matter how small that capacity may seem to the others.
